E-Device Policy-Yokosuka Middle School

E-Devices that are brought to school will be used for educational activities. Some examples of e-devices include the iPhone, iPad, Androids, Kindle, Nook, Sony Reader, etc. Students in 6th through 8th grade may use e-devices in school while under teacher supervision. Students may connect these devices to the Internet or use as cell phones only at their teacher's discretion.

RESPONSIBILITIES

A parent/guardian signature below indicates that the parent/guardian and student acknowledge sole responsibility for the device and its content. Digital media must comply with the student Acceptable Use Policy.

- Failure to comply with this policy will result in the revocation of e-device privileges.
- The length of time of the revocation will depend on the nature of the violation and will be at administrator discretion.

Policies outlined apply when students are at school or attending a school-sponsored or related activity off-campus. No privately owned student devices may be attached to the school's network or Internet services.

- Individual students are solely responsible for their privately owned devices and are the only person permitted to use them.
- Yokosuka Middle School, Pacific East District, nor DODEA will assume any responsibility for the loss
 of, theft of, or damage to personal devices.

Students must obtain teacher permission before using the device in class.

- E-devices are allowed for in class use only at the teacher's discretion.
- E-devices are **NOT** allowed to be used in common areas such as the hallways, cafeteria, etc.
- Students must turn off and put away the device when requested by a teacher.
- Students may use the device under teacher supervision only.

Policy Acknowledgement

- The school may examine a student's personal device and search its contents if there is a reason to believe that school policies, regulations, or guidelines of usage have been violated.
- Inappropriate use or violation of the Acceptable Use Policy on personal equipment WILL result in disciplinary action including but not limited to permanent revocation of e device privileges.
