- □ This isn't ready to share—but it's getting there!
- □ I need more voice—or a *different* voice.

- □ It has a hint of voice—but it's not ready to share.
- □ The writing doesn't show anything about me.

#### 1

- I'm not "at home" in this paper. I can't hear one whisper of my real voice.
- □ I definitely would NOT share this aloud.
- □ This is an "anybody" voice. It's not me.
- □ I just could not get excited about this topic.
- □ I need help choosing a topic or revising for voice.

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
